2017 Roof and Porch Repair Program Opens Thursday, September 8th

The Roof and Porch Repair Program opens on Thursday, September 8, 2016 at 9:00 am and will remain open until 5:00 pm. This program provides income eligible applicants a one-time service for roof and porch repair/replacement. Residents can register by calling the 311 or Department of Planning and Development at 312-744-3653. Online registration will also be available at www.cityofchicago.org/roofandporch. This is a highly competitive program and grants are awarded via lottery.

3rd Ward Elementary Schools Show Significant Growth

Over the prior academic year, schools across the 3rd Ward showed significant growth in reading, math and attendance. This reflects a larger citywide trend for CPS schools, which are showing noticeable academic gains.

Preliminary reports from CPS indicate that two schools in the ward have raised their academic rating, Woodson and Hendricks. Congratulations to those schools and their faculty, students and parents. Additionally, 5 schools raised their reading growth, 5 schools increased their math growth and 5 schools exceeded the district's average attendance rate.

This is a great start for our neighborhood schools, but there is definitely more work to be done. In order to provide badly needed funding to our schools, Alderman Dowell surplused over \$2 million in Tax Increment Financing money which went directly to 3rd Ward schools. Working in consultation with each school's principal, TIF funds were spent on important programs such as: computers, after-school programming, social and emotional supports, professional development, bullying prevention and more. This additional funding, as well as the positive growth in academic performance seen over the last school year will be a springboard for our schools and students for the coming year! Thank you to all of the people who work so hard every day to make our schools a great place to learn, and especially to the Bronzeville Community Action Council who play an integral role in making positive change for neighborhood schools.

Alderman Dowell Attends South Loop Neighborhood Watch Safety Update Meeting

Organized by a concerned group of South Loop residents in response to crime in their area, Alderman Dowell attended an important community meeting at Spoke and Bird on August 30th. While residents were understandably concerned about public safety, the event was very constructive in nature as residents offered their help and potential solutions to the crime problem. One of the major outcomes of the meeting was the establishment of a South Loop Neighborhood Watch program. Mariano's on King Drive to Open by October 11th

The new Mariano's grocery store is set to open October 11th. This project was made possible because of a partnership between the 3rd and 4th Wards to deal with the lack of grocery stores in the Bronzeville neighborhood. Thank you to Mariano's and all of the other individuals who worked hard to bring this project to the neighborhood.

47th Street Streetscape

Work to beautify the public way on 47th Street around the Green Line "L" station is ongoing. In addition to new trees being planted, the sidewalk has been upgraded with decorative pavers, the intersections received new brick walkways and the CTA station is getting an upgrade. These improvements will enhance this busy commercial corridor, helping to attract business and make the street a more pleasant place on which to travel.

Beware of Squatters

Vacant houses are a haven for squatters. If you see something that doesn't look right - people entering and exiting a long vacant property, light inside an abandoned home, increased trash outside of an unused home - call the police immediately. They can investigate the issue and ensure that the property isn't being used illegally. If you do not want to call the police, you can always call Alderman Dowell's office at 773-373-9273.

Squatters have NO legal rights to a property. They are essentially trespassing, just as they would be in an occupied home. Chicago requires that all vacant buildings be boarded up and registered with the city. To check a vacant building's registration, please click <https://ipweb.cityofchicago.org/VBR/>. If you notice a vacant building is not following the Municipal Code, please call 3-1-1 to report the property.

Dyett Arts High School Safe Passage Routes Announced

Chicago Public Schools, in partnership with the Chicago Police Department and the City of Chicago has expanded the District's successful Safe Passage Program to provide safe routes to and from school every day for your child. Walter H. Dyett High School for the Arts will have safe passage routes on King Drive from 47th Street to 51st Street, Cottage Grove Avenue from 47th Street to 51st Street and on 51st Street from Prairie Avenue to Cottage Grove Avenue. Please utilize these staffed routes when entering and exiting the school.



XS Tennis Construction Underway

The 3rd Ward celebrated the start of construction of XS Tennis Village, a \$16.9 million, 150,918 square foot world class tennis facility in Washington Park at 53rd and State Street. The state-of-the-art facility will house 12 indoor courts, 15 outdoor courts, a fitness center, running track, training space and classrooms. Chicago's XS Tennis, led by Chicagoan Kamau Murray is the largest, most successful minority-owned tennis organization in the nation, serving more than 2,000 Chicago Public School (CPS) students through its free in-school Tennis XSpress program and more than 2,300 Chicago youth and residents annually. Alderman Dowell is proud to have been part of an awesome collaboration to bring this new asset to the 3rd Ward.

City of Chicago-owned property can be purchased through the Adjacent Neighbor Land Acquisition Program. This program allows residents to purchase city-owned vacant lots directly next to their property at a steeply reduced price. **THIS IS NOT THE DOLLAR LOT PROGRAM.** All sales of city-owned property are subject to aldermanic approval and review by the Department of Planning and Development. 31st Street Bus Pilot Program

The Chicago Transit Authority is conducting a pilot program to determine whether there is sufficient ridership to reestablish the 31st Street Bus line. This route was previously shut down because of low ridership. The pilot program starts on September 6th and will run for 6 months between Ashland and Rhodes streets along 31st connecting to the 35th Street red line and green line stations.

Street Resurfacing - Pershing Road from State St. to Cottage Grove

Alderman Dowell and the Chicago Department of Transportation are announcing an upcoming resurfacing project on E. Pershing Rd. from S. State St. to S. Cottage Grove Ave. This street is part of the Chicago Department of Transportation's Arterial Street Resurfacing Program.

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin on September 6, 2016 pending clearance from and coordination with existing utilities and weather permitting. The work will include ADA sidewalk improvements, curb and gutter removal and replacement, milling the existing asphalt pavement, asphalt paving, concrete bus pad construction, and striping.

During construction, temporary "No Parking" signs will be periodically installed as required for each activity listed above. These temporary signs will restrict parking during working hours, while adhering to rush hour restrictions, for the completion of the work. All work on this corridor is scheduled to be completed by October 13, 2016.

Water Main Replacement Project - Indiana Avenue from Garfield Boulevard to 59th Street, 55th Pl. from Indiana Avenue to S. King Drive, 56th Street from Indiana Avenue to King Drive and Prairie Avenue from Garfield Boulevard to 56th St.

Alderman Dowell and the Department of Water Management (DWM) are announcing an upcoming water main replacement project for Indiana Avenue from Garfield Boulevard to 59th Street, 55th Pl. from Indiana Avenue to S. King Drive, 56th Street from Indiana Avenue to King Drive and Prairie Avenue from Garfield Boulevard to 56th St.

The project is scheduled to start by late August 2016. When DWM is working in the street, they may close or limit it to traffic for safety reasons, but residents will always be able to reach their homes or businesses. Outside of working hours, a travel lane will be left open for local traffic only. DWM will post "No Parking" signs as needed (generally 7:00 am to 4:00 pm). Parking outside of those hours will be allowed, but cars must be moved by the start of the next work-day.



How to Describe Suspect from the Unknown to Known

The Chicago Police Department has published the following guide on how to identify and describe potential suspects.

In today's charged climate, many people are reluctant to help the community in reporting criminal activity because they don't know what to report, or are afraid they might provide an inaccurate description, or they don't feel comfortable in providing descriptions of individuals for fear of being thought of as profiling by distinguishing individual characteristics or features in a situation. A few reminders:

- 911 Call takers & Dispatchers - remember, most people taking the initial call are civilians - not all have equal experiences. When taking the call depending on the nature, they may route it to a 911 police dispatcher. If you have issue with the 911 call taker or the in providing the appropriate urgency to your issue, request their supervisor.
- Remain calm-speak slowly and clearly.
- Explain what type of emergency you are reporting. If the crime is taking place while you are calling, tell the call taker the incident is in progress
- Focus on behavior profile when describing incident - use action words. Describe what they are doing that is the emergency support requested
- The call taker will request your name. However, you do not have to identify yourself when reporting a crime, unless you yourself are the victim of the crime.
- Give your location, if it is different from the scene of the emergency.
- Note: In some instances, you may not want the police to come to your home or otherwise identify you as the person who made the call. Expressly tell the call taker if you do not want the police to come to your home.
- Give the phone number you are calling from.
- Stay on the line, while the call taker passes your information to the dispatcher, in case there is additional information or instructions.

To capture a criminal in this electronic age, it is of utmost importance for the police to promptly obtain an accurate description. This brochure points out the identification data needed by the police in order to apprehend suspects. Become familiar with the step-by-step procedures outlined in this pamphlet. Please keep this information close at hand so that you can give the police an accurate description of any criminal or suspect you may observe.

ADA Ramp Improvements in and Around 3rd Ward

The below ramp improvements will be completed at different times from now through June 2017. The each ramp improvement should take approximately 7-14 days once the work has started. The improvements will remove the non-compliant corners which will be replaced with compliant ADA ramps that meet current CDOT ADA Standards. One side of the street will be improved at a time to allow pedestrians to use the opposite sidewalk. The areas adjacent to the ramps will also be improved and meet existing conditions.

- S. Archer Avenue from Canal St. to Pitney Court
- S. Indiana Avenue from 31st St. to 35th St.
- S. Michigan Avenue from 26th St. to 42nd St.
- S. Michigan Avenue from 43rd St. to Garfield Boulevard
- S. State St. from 51st St. to 60th St.
- W. Wentworth Avenue from Pershing Road to 47th St.

Alderman Dowell Chief Sponsor of Municipal Depository Ordinance

In order to provide better oversight of public funds, Alderman Dowell is a chief sponsor of an ordinance to make necessary changes to the laws governing municipal depositories. Municipal depositories are financial institutions that hold money for the City of Chicago government.

The ordinance will ensure that any financial institution functioning as a municipal depository is complying with their Community Reinvestment Act requirements, which ensure that lending institutions make money available to undeserved communities.
